INSTITUTIONAL GRADUATION RATE: 34%

METHODOLOGY: The institutional graduation rate is calculated based on the cohort of students enrolled in the Occupational Associate (OA), Associate of Science (AS), and Bachelor of Science (BS) degree programs who successfully completed their respective programs during the reported 2025 calendar year. In strict alignment with accreditor reporting standards, this rate measures the percentage of students who graduated within 150% of the published program length, inclusive of all on-time graduates.
